Fabrik artists Parin Heidari, an Iranian-born digital artist, Lisa Schulte, the renowned LA-based neon artist, and Jesus Hernandez, an LA-based artist who merges geometry with the beauty of cityscapes, join in the conversation.

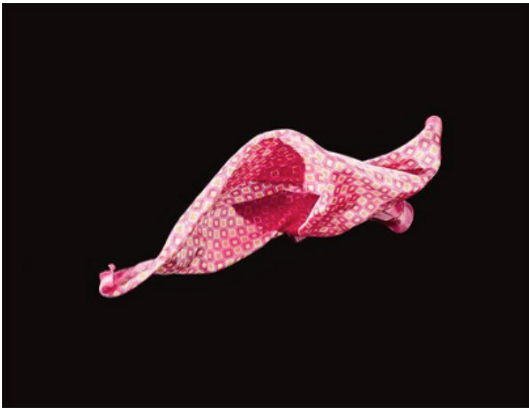

One of nine projects in this year’s DIVERSEartLA exhibition program, Reactive Elements is an installation that addresses the fragility of our natural resources and the impact of human activities on Earth. Images projected on voile—a suspended piece of fabric—give visitors a glimpse at our individual footprint and the cumulative impact of anthropogenic activities on the environment. The relatable imagery prompts the viewer toward realizing the collective role we all play in contributing to the planet’s destruction.

Jin Hyu Lee: Donde Voy

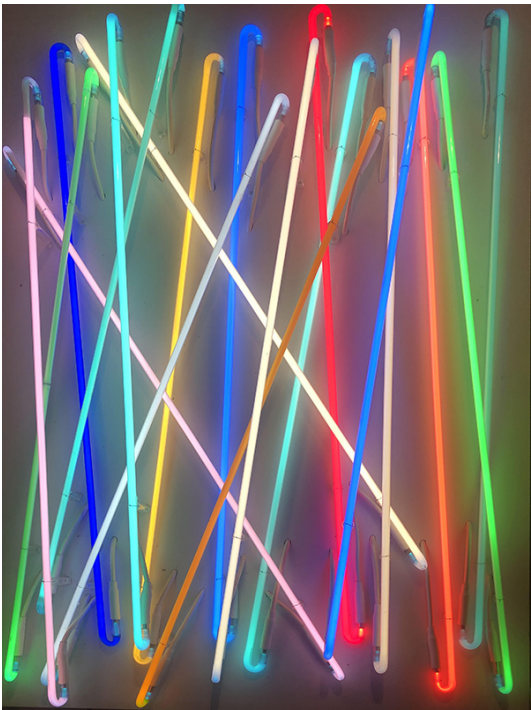
Jim Hyu Lee is focused on how to express the objects he sees, interpreted with different perspectives, by trying to recreate the meaning of the things scattered around him. The artist enjoys experimenting, using different methods, such as splitting the space in canvas, attempting to escape from the ordinary views, searching for new dimensions of objects around him. His works are blended sentiment derived from the mixture of conventional painting and digitized culture that has become the fact of life, with historical and ethnic traces.



Philip Vaughan: Evocation In Light

English artist Philip Vaughan first became interested in neon and light art while taking a course on the theory of light and color at Chelsea Art School, London,. He was intrigued to learn that paint mixes differently than light, and by the idea that light could be used as a medium to make art. Combining this with his love of sculpture and installation, he began experimenting with all three. His experiments led to a sculpture for the Hayward Gallery on London’s Southbank and an 80-foot diameter hemispherical inflatable dome theater with projected light shows for entrepreneur and filmmaker John Bloomfield.



Since moving to the United States, he worked for a while at Walt Disney Imagineering where he continued to learn about lighting, theatrics, computer controls and construction. Vaughan has continued to create art and experiment with neon, sculpture and architecture as art and technology evolve.

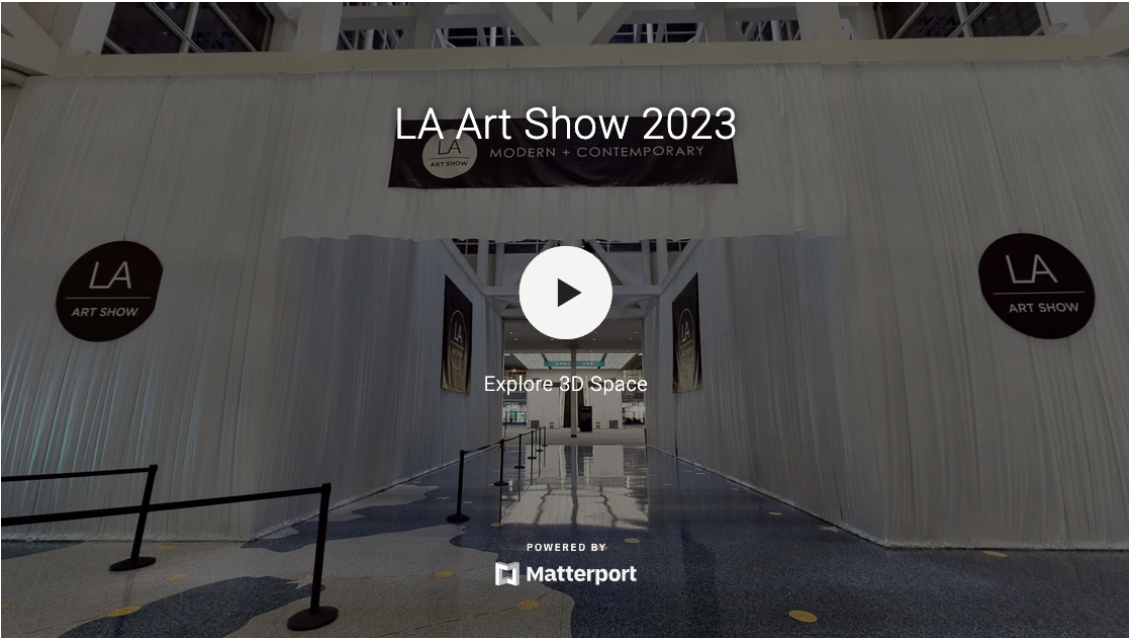
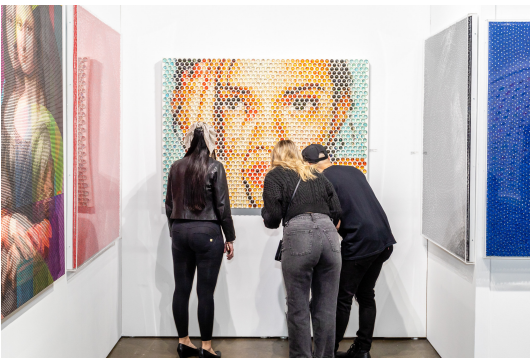

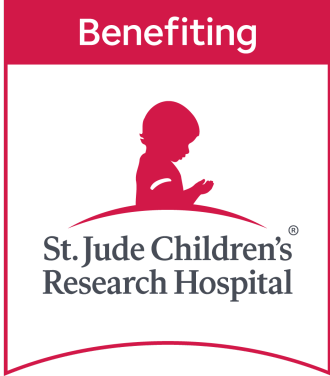
