This month we're pleased to highlight three of the Korean galleries:

EK Gallery

Based in the heart of LA's Koreatown, EK Gallery is a community-inspired venue founded by Director Eunice Kim. "I want the artists in our dynamic city of Los Angeles to feel inspired and motivated to pursue their aspirations, to express their talent, and to engage with their audience. My hope is that this love of art and culture will be shared as a communal experience, deepening our connection as a community," said Kim.

The gallery's LA Art Show presentation will feature artists Hyun Joo Choe and Chuni Park.

Hyun Joo Choe


Born in Seoul, South Korea, Hyun Joo Choe is a contemporary mixed media artist who often uses crystals in her paintings. In her work, she likes to explore the theme of life and reincarnation, where life is conceived, born, blossomed and disappeared again.

Chuni Park

Chuni Park is a Korean artist who seeks to amalgamate western and eastern styles in his paintings. Park's practice mostly consists of painting traditional themes focused on localized natural and cultural phenomena, while often divorced from the rigid strictures of conventional Korean painting.

J&J Art Inc. is a Los Angeles based contemporary art gallery representing new and emerging artists from South Korea and abroad. Located in LA's Koreatown, the gallery was founded in 2018. For its presentation at the 2023 LA Art Show, J&J Art Inc. will feature an exhibition of work by artist Lee Jin Hyu.

Lee Jin Hyu has traveled extensively and studied art in the Middle East and Europe. As his works show, he is an artist who aways seeks freedom and always lives as a stranger. The theme of his works to be exhibited at the LA Art Show is "Donde Voy," immigrants' joys and dreams.

The expression "Aren't we all strangers?, Where do I go now" is an introduction to the exhibition of the works, including objects, media, and LEDs on flat drawings.

Gallery Chaman is engaged in representing Korean artists in the world market through collaboration with overseas galleries. The gallery also serves as a bridge for overseas galleries to establish networks in Korea. For its 2023 LA Art Show exhibition, Gallery Chaman highlights Sori Choi, an internationally-recognized Korean percussionist known for performing traditional Korean music styles and contemporary music.




Choi will show his artwork for the first time in Los Angeles at the LA Art Show. Working on copper plates, aluminum and other metals, Choi visually expresses his music using dance-like movements to paint, fire to transform color, and objects like drumsticks to create indentations based on the idea that every object and energy has its own sound.


