LA Art Show Announces Exhibitor Lineup for 31st Edition

The LA Art Show returns to the Los Angeles Convention Center from January 7-11, 2026, for its 31st edition. As the city's largest and longest-established art fair, the 2026 show will feature galleries and institutions from around the world, reinforcing Los Angeles's position as a global art center.

Under the leadership of director and producer Kassandra Voyagis, this year's program includes several notable developments. The show will debut an invitation-only **Latin American Pavilion**, curated by Marisa Caichiolo, who also serves as curator of the LA Art Show's **DIVERSEartLA** program. She was recently selected to co-curate Chile's official pavilion at the 61st Venice Biennale of Art in 2026. The pavilion addresses underrepresentation of Latin American artists at major international fairs, focusing on themes of memory, migration, and identity.

The fair welcomes its first exhibitors from Ireland, Switzerland, Poland, France, Israel, Greece, and South Africa, alongside an expanded presence from United Kingdom galleries and 15 participating South Korean galleries. Featured presentations include internationally

renowned Israeli artist **Yigal Ozeri's** hyper-realistic paintings from Corridor Contemporary (Tel Aviv), celebrated South African artist **Esther Mahlangu** presented by Art of Contemporary Africa (Johannesburg), and a solo exhibition of abstract paintings by **Sylvester Stallone** from Provident Fine Art, making its LA Art Show debut.

The show continues its partnership with the **American Heart Association** as charity beneficiary, with 15% of ticket proceeds supporting their Life is Why[™] campaign. **Athletes for Life™ Foundation** returns as an exhibitor, continuing their commitment to arts education programming.




