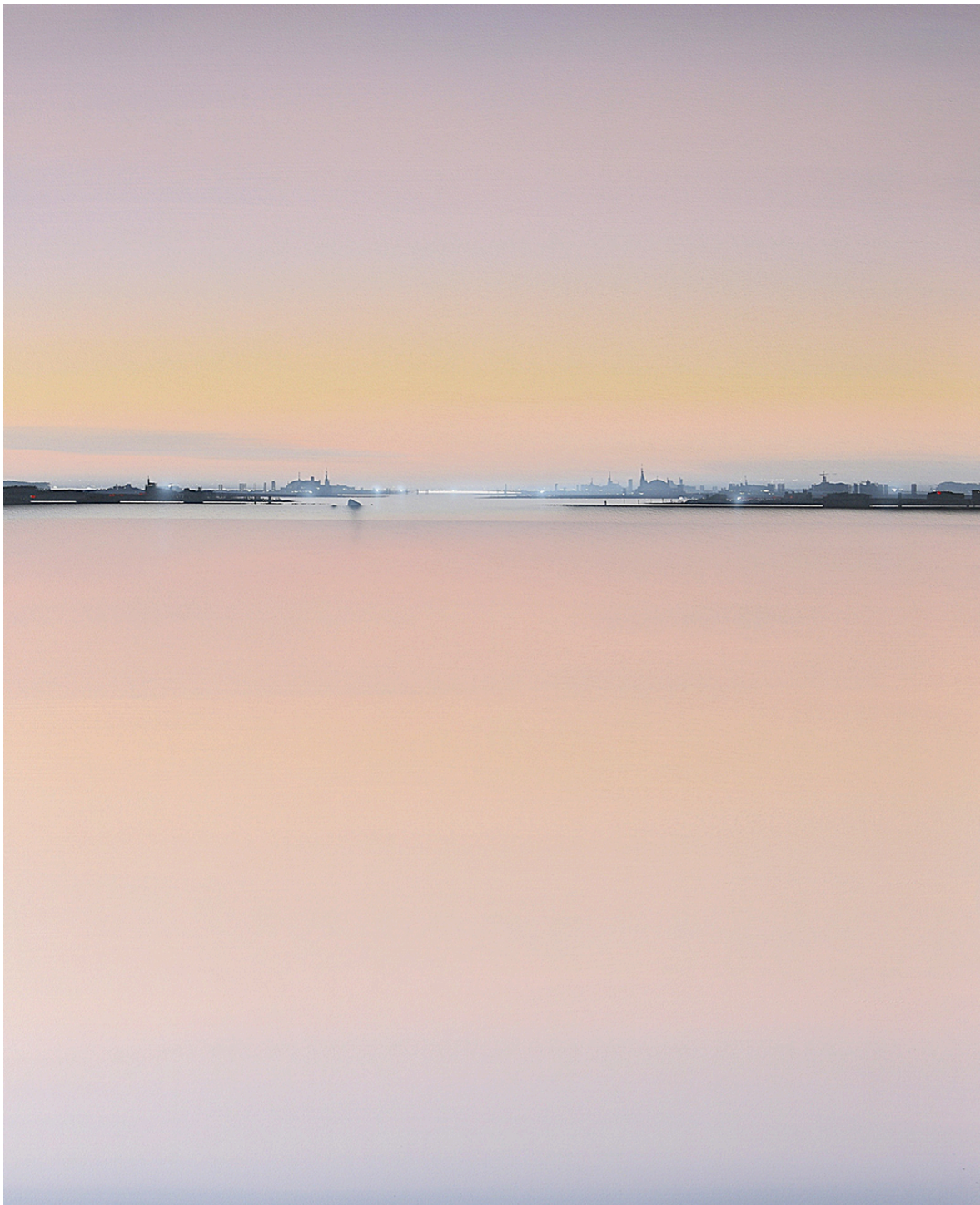

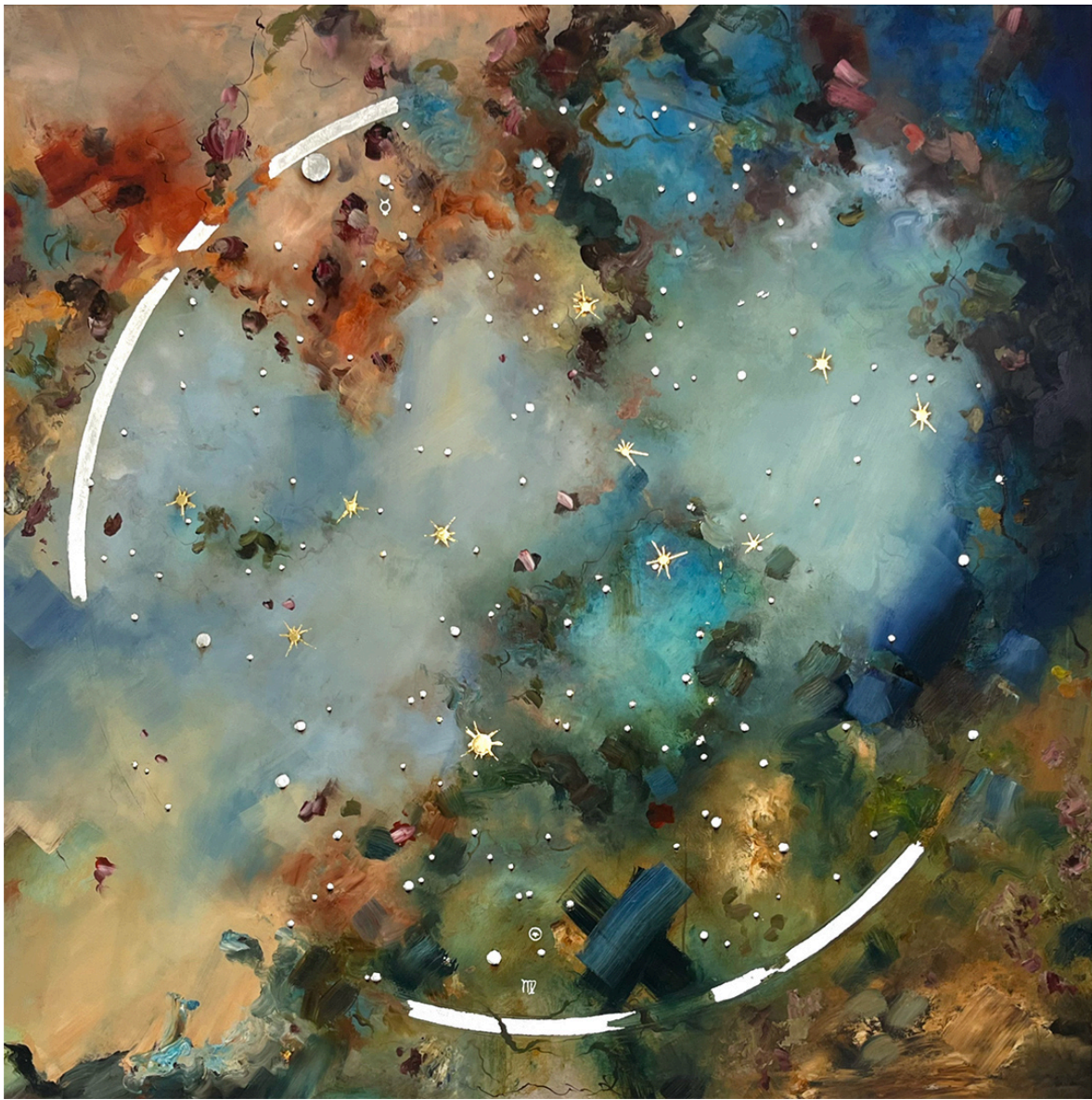

Stallone has painted since his youth, often using the medium as a way to explore ideas and characters during the development of his screenplays. While primarily known for his work in film, painting has remained a consistent and personal form of creative expression. His work has been the subject of previous retrospectives at the State Russian Museum in St. Petersburg and the Musée d'Art Moderne et d'Art Contemporain in Nice. This presentation with Provident Fine Art marks his first major gallery showcase in several years, with the majority of works available for acquisition.

Provident Fine Art specializes in 19th- and 20th-century French and American Impressionism, Post-Impressionism, and Modern and Contemporary art. 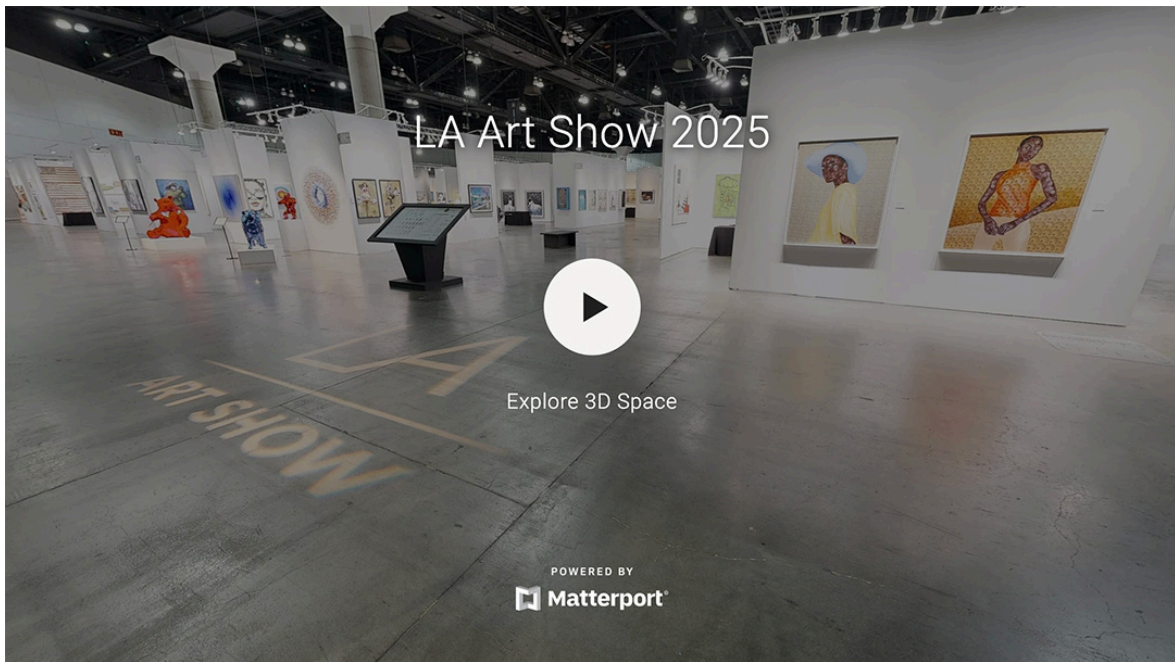

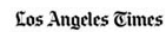
