J&J Art, Inc. presents Jinny Suh's latest works exploring themes of freedom, elegance, and human connection through Korean Hanji, traditional handmade paper with over 8,000 years of history. Suh uses symbols from nature including chickens, birds, and butterflies, rendered in vibrant traditional Korean colors that reinterpret time-honored values for contemporary viewers.

Gallery Wald features Moon Min's sculptural series that explores modern humanity in relation to technology and identity. Working primarily with metals like aluminum and copper,

Moon simplifies the human figure into geometric forms within square frameworks, symbolizing the structured society we inhabit. The works reveal how repressed emotions surface through subtle traces in posture and form.

Art of Contemporary Africa presents the globally acclaimed visual artist and cultural ambassador of the Ndebele nation, Esther Mahlangu. In 1991, Dr. Mahlangu became the first woman and first African invited to participate in the BMW Art Car Collection. The Melrose Gallery/Art of Contemporary Africa showcases several of her bright, abstract paintings and vessels, alongside a video interview and timeline featuring career highlights.

Corridor Contemporary offers a solo presentation by one of today's most celebrated painters, known for his hyper-realistic technique and cinematic sensibility. John Martin Gallery presents five paintings from the personal collection of Paul Simonon, bassist of The Clash, that trace his lifelong connection to biker culture, from 1960s Paddington to 1980s California. The works depict jackets, gloves, bikes, and helmets as quiet still lifes, revealing the influence of biker culture on Simonon's artistic output in both painting and music.

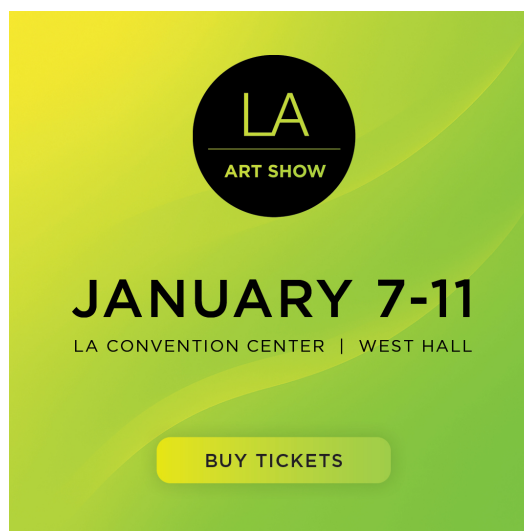

















