We began by walking down the first wide aisle the entrance to the art exhibition hall led us to and slowly explored the varied art that filled it. We walked by Fox 11 reporter Susan Hirasuna and introduced ourselves to her. The friendly reporter asked about our work. I explained, “We are a media company which covers topics, people, and events of interest to the Chicano community of Southern California.” She replied by asking who our favorite Chicano artists in the show were. After a moment of reflection, I answered, “Isaac Pelayo who is represented here by Bruce Lurie Art Gallery. I like his use of color and historical references he contrasts with modern symbolism.” I then pointed her towards the direction of the Bruce Lurie Art Gallery booth 1312 as we said goodbye. I wish I had remembered to tell her about the work of Isaac Pelayo’s father, Antonio Pelayo. Antonio Pelayo is a Chicano artist who, according to his website ([AntonioPelayo.com](#)), uses his artwork to question ideologies of home, identity, and trust. I especially liked Antonio Pelayo’s paintings of paleteros exhibited at the Bruce Lurie Gallery booth because of childhood memories of these ice cream vendors. These vendors roam the Latino neighborhoods of Southern California interrupting games ringing bells attached to their carts they sell ice cream from. The neighborhood kids respond by dashing home to ask parents, grandparents, siblings, and neighbors for money.

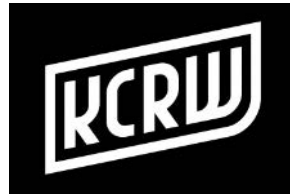

According to his Manifesto, it considers letters as worthy artistic subject matter with the same value as a portrait or landscape. This concept is not radical within the Eastern tradition of calligraphic arts, wherein the brushwork in a handwritten character has a long and painterly tradition of students and masters. However, to the Western mind, the art of language has been associated with the "low arts" of graphic design and advertising. Chinese lettering serves as a secondary leitmotif to the Latin/Roman alphabet in earlier canvases of the Alphatype series.

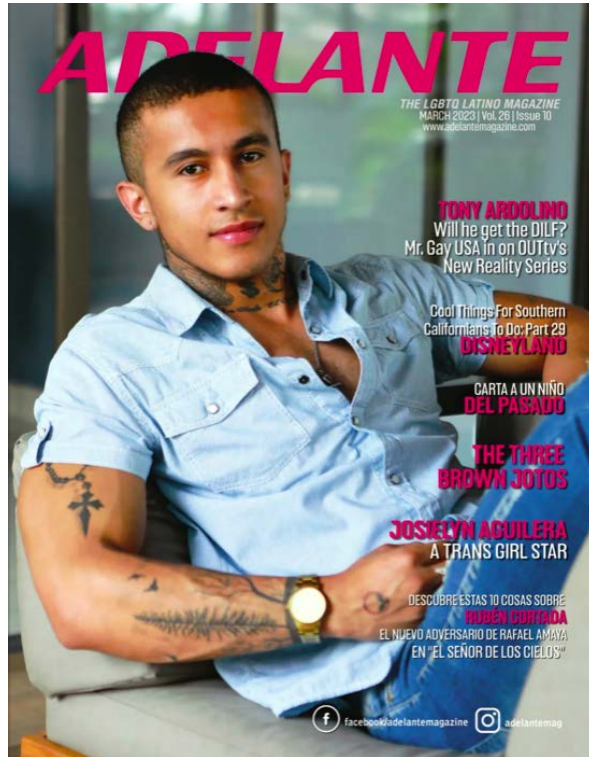

**LA ART SHOW** WRAPS UP A SUCCESSFUL RETURN WITH AN IMPRESSIVE GLOBAL LINEUP AND AN IMPACTFUL CLIMATE AGENDA

The LA Art Show, largest and longest-running art fair, wrapped up its 28th iteration following a triumphant return to the Los Angeles Convention Center on February 15 through 19, 2023. Guided by the leadership of LA Art Show producer and director Kawandja Voytko, the fair kicked off the City's art season, uniting galleries, curators, collectors, and celebrities alike. LA Art Show 2023 saw a more significant global presence than ever, with over 120 galleries and 35% higher attendance than last year's show, bringing the total attendees to around 60,000.

The fair debuted with a successful Opening Night Premier Party hosted by actress Ashley Tisdale, raising funds for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, the show's charitable partner of 9 years, who received 15% of all ticket proceeds. Visitors gathered to see iconic LA artist Robert Rauschenberg's new work as part of the series, the *acRED* Project. "Protect The Life-Givers" was on view throughout and is the third mural in a three-city series - Albuquerque, New York City, and now Los Angeles - addressing the epidemics of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and the #MMIW movement.

The European Pavilion returned along with an increased presence from Asia, marked by the launch of the Japanese Pavilion and 15 galleries from South Korea, a testament to the country's thriving art scene, which was celebrated with an opening night reception for Korean dignitaries.

"I spent much of 2022 traveling to scout international participants, and it was inspiring to see attendees blown away by the scope of the work represented at this year's show. It was an honor to help bring it all together, and we will continue to expand our international presence," says LA Art Show producer Kawandja Voytko.



A few LA Art Show 2023 highlights included:

- Ramona Otto's *Holy Cow! Pray For Peaceful Coexistence* made its debut at LA Art Show (BG Gallery). As a call for peace in a divisive world, Holy Cow combines thousands of religious artifacts from major religious groups, human rights leaders, and iconic peace symbolism.
- Fine-time exhibitor Markowicz Fine Art showcased pioneering artist Gerda Feuerstein's hyper-realistic sculpture of a minotaur, "Bibi on the Ball," which captured the attention of visitors and the local networks alike.
- Song "Word Art House's" exhibit was based on the song "LA Woman" by The Doors, which featured an original artwork by legendary guitarist Robby Krieger inspired by the mystical words "MI MOJO RISEN," an anagram to the name "Jim Morrison."
- Artist MARCKO's "VEGENSTROM XXU" at Licht Feld Gallery attracted the crowds, showing a woman trapped in a box filled with worms, searching for a way out, seemingly unaffected by the hopelessness of her situation yet never losing faith. The power of MARCKO's work is enhanced by his choice of materials, transforming an ordinary appliance into a stunning video sculpture.
- Artwork by actor Val Kilmer at Fabrik Projects included works from his icon painting series in which Kilmer

investigates the nature of icons and explores themes of identity and American mythic archetypes.

The fair's non-commercial platform DIVERSEARTLA, curated by Maria Gaidichilo, inspired dialogue through art, featuring 9 interdisciplinary projects examining the climate crisis, including The Museum of Latin American Art's "When God Was A Woman, 1980-2021" - a double-sided mural - by artist and ecologist, Judy Baca. Thirteen women represent Latina, Chicana, and all women, with their naked bodies shown in the volcano synonymous with life. At the same time, the other side depicts a goddess possessing vital energy, Mother Earth. Korean artist HanHo's "Eternal Light" showcased a massive nine-part multimedia work presented by PufferSpace Gallery (City of Glendale Library). The work, inspired by Michelangelo's "The Last Judgment," re-imagined an apocalyptic scenario for the 21st century.

LA Art Show 2023 ended with DIVERSEARTLA presenting their inaugural Museum Acquisition Award - created and chosen by Spain's La Neomudéjar Museum - to artist Hogan Brown at Arcadia Contemporary, who will now be part of the Museum's collection.

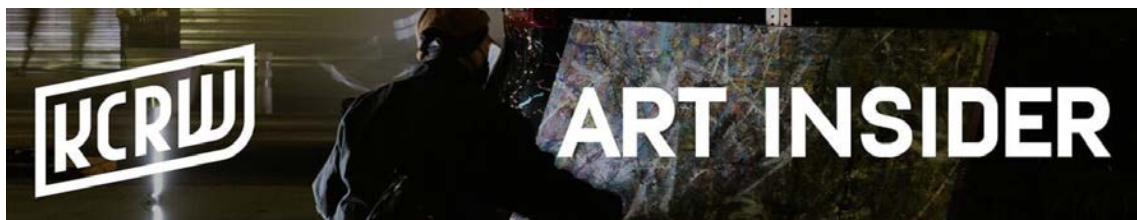

## Downtown's largest art show broadens reach for 2023

For 28 years, the LA Art Show has gathered artists and institutions for what is the largest and longest running LA art fair.

This year, it will fill 180,000 square feet of the LA Convention Center from Wednesday, Feb. 15, to Sunday, Feb. 19. It marks the beginning of the city's 2023 art season.

This year, the art fair celebrates international artists while putting climate change front and center. Kassandra Voyagis, the producer and director of the show, spent much of 2022 engaged in international travel, scouting out art that she wanted to bring to Los Angeles.

It's allowed her to grow the show's international participation, in particular, the Asian component. This year there will be 15 galleries from Korea and a new Japanese Pavilion joining the returning European pavilion.

"With the travel restrictions ending, everybody's really excited to finally come back," Voyagis said, adding they will have about 120 exhibitors this year including galleries, museums, nonprofits and individual artists.

"Being one of the largest and longest-running shows in LA, I want to bring as much of the international component and global presence as I can for the community here."

This year's show casts a spotlight on the events in Ukraine and the suffering that has taken place since the Russian invasion. Ukrainian artist Denis Sarazhin and his wife were stranded in the United States and living as refugees. However, thanks to support from generous donors and a GoFundMe campaign, he bought supplies and started creating here.

"Arcadia Contemporary had a focus on Ukrainian artists even before everything happened," Voyagis said. "Sarazhin was preparing his work and then found himself being a refugee. He's had to create a lot of new pieces. That's a testament of what we represent in LA. People came together and helped him and now he's going to be able to show his work."

Another special exhibition is TRANSFORMATION by MRG Fine Art in partnership with Zero Two 20. The goal is to create an open platform for artists with diverse backgrounds. Voyagis said they originally wanted to do all women artists, but the concept grew into highlighting trans artists, LGBTQ artists and those with diverse LA backgrounds.

The largest portion of the show is the "Modern + Contemporary" section, which includes contemporary painting, illustrations and sculptures from galleries in LA and around the world.

Other sections include Featured Exhibitions, Project Space and Works on Paper.

The LA Art Show donates 15% of all ticket proceeds to St. Jude Children's Research

Hospital.

"The LA Art Show is an art show for everybody," Voyagis said. "You can start collecting or be a seasoned collector. It's a great opportunity to see a staple of the arts downtown. You can enjoy the arts and the educational component while supporting a great charity."

### DIVERSEartLA focuses on water scarcity

Long a major component of the LA Art Show, DIVERSEartLA returns this year with an even more focused look at climate change. Whereas last year's show looked at climate change through a broad lens, this year's projects look specifically at water.

"In California, we've had a lot of issues with water," Voyagis said. "The water focus was important because of how it has affected us in California and many other parts of the world."

DIVERSEartLA is the noncommercial platform that connects local and international art institutions to generate thoughtful dialogue.

Marisa Caichiole has been the curator of DIVERSEartLA since its inception in 2015.

She has always focused on important topics in the art world. This year, she is bringing in nine institutions that are each sparking conversations with a variety of interactive exhibits.

"The overall curatorial umbrella in this platform for the past three years has been to see how each of these institutions are really engaging with the change that humanity and the planet is experiencing," Caichiole said.

"We can create consciousness about it. I know we cannot change things that we have done as humans to the planet, but we can at least start having a conversation with all these institutions to see how arts and culture can engage with social consciousness."

This year, DIVERSEartLA features nine interdisciplinary projects:

- **Cooling resources:** Downtown Los Angeles is an urban heat island and Skid Row residents are more vulnerable than most. DIVERSEartLA will provide a site-specific area for community engagement exploring the importance of water, cooling resources and potential solutions. "Cooling Resources is actually helping homeless with water during the summer," Caichiole said. "Creating at least a conversation around this topic through art in a creative way makes it a little more accessible."

- **Museum of Latin American Art (MOLAA)** is presenting a double-sided mural of three panels by ecofeminist and artist Judy Baca. Titled "When God Was a Woman, 1980-2021," it was developed during a workshop and the 13 participating women are represented in the triptych. "Judy Baca is an icon in Los Angeles as a Chicano artist that really works a lot with murals of women," Caichiole said. "This particular mural is about ... embracing and connecting the dots between the planet, mother and the





# February is the art-fairest of them all

Ready your comfiest shoes, flouciest outfits and edgiest eyewear — it's art fair season. Last spring, L.A.'s art fairs marched forward despite Omicron surges, an uncertain public and COVID precautions that, for many fairs, included limiting capacity. Fair dates were more staggered as well, with the L.A. Art Show opening in mid-January and three additional art fairs — Frieze Los Angeles, Felix LA and Spring/Break Art Show LA — running during what's now referred to as Frieze Week in mid-February. This year, the fairs return in full force — and all at once. The 2023 season will be bigger than ever, with more international participants, full visitor capacity and one new fair added to the mix. Five art fairs will run concurrently starting Wednesday.

So what's back, what's new and where to start?

## L.A.'S LONGEST-RUNNING ART FAIR RETURNS

The 28th edition of the L.A. Art Show — the city's longest-running art fair — will be held in the Los Angeles Convention Center's West Hall from Wednesday to Feb. 19. The fair pushed its run dates forward for 2023 to coincide with Frieze Week. Frieze, a heavy hitter in the art fair world, debuted in L.A. in 2019 and brings with it an influx of global galleries, artists and collectors. Art happenings begin at 10 a.m. on Wednesday outside the convention center, and the L.A. Art Show wanted to take advantage of the moment.

"We thought it'd be beneficial for collectors and galleries and attendees — for everyone — to have a (coordinated) art event, to go to multiple shows," LAAS director and producer Kassandra Voyagis says. "We confirmed the dates for 2024 as well."

The LAAS will be larger this year than last, with more than 120 participating galleries from around the country and internationally, compared with 70 last year, all showing modern and contemporary art. It will also feature a larger "global presence," Voyagis says. In addition to its European Pavilion, the fair is debuting a Japanese pavilion, featuring six galleries, and it will be showing more South Korean galleries than in the past. It is all.

"It's been a tough couple of years everywhere, for everyone," Voyagis says. "But it's easier to travel now than the previous two years and I wanted a more international component. And we have such a large Korean community in L.A."

The fair's long-running DIVERSARTLA, a noncommercial section curated by Marisa Caschiolo, is a point of differentiation for the LAAS, Voyagis says. This year, it will feature nine local and international art institutions and nonprofits addressing the global climate crisis through multimedia presentations and immersive experiences. The Museum of Latin American Art, for example, will present L.A. "eco-feminist" artist Judy Baca's three-panel, double-sided mural "Matriarchal Mural: When God Was a Woman, 1889-2022." The Cleistride Central Library's



ReflectSpace Gallery will present Korean Artist Han Ho's spookily-minded, nine-part multimedia installation, "Eternal Light," inspired by M. C. Escher's "The Last Judgment."

"It's about education and museums and community engagement," Voyagis says of DIVERSARTLA. "We give 25% of our platform, meaning space and built on the fair floor, to this programming and there's no profit on our end."

As to whether there are

enough collectors to sustain five simultaneous art fairs in L.A., Voyagis points to Miami and Miami Beach, which host more than a dozen concurrent art fairs between them the first week of December. "It just creates excitement and more international travel and the possibility for collectors and attendees to have more shows to visit," she says. "There's diversification, so there's choice."

## FELIX LA RINGS IN FIVE YEARS

Meanwhile, Felix LA is returning to the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel from Wednesday to Feb. 19 for its fifth iteration. The contemporary art fair will again be situated in cabanas around the hotel's palm tree-rimmed pool and in suites across two floors of the hotel. The fair won't be larger this year, per se, but it will be longer. It will open one day earlier than

last year — a decision made so as not to overlap with Frieze Los Angeles' Thursday opening, fair co-founder Mila Morán says. "Frieze is in Santa Monica and we didn't want to bottleneck people driving back and forth on a VIP day, so we elected to space that out," he says.

Felix LA 2023 will feature 65 international exhibitors, about 25% of which are new participants. The fair aims to provide the "anti-trade show experience," Morán says — contemporary art shown in an intimate hotel setting amid a cool, relaxed vibe. "It's a much different experience than walking into a trade show with a ticket and sort of being herded around, in big hallways, gallery after gallery after gallery. You can take a break and sit around the pool," he says.

Highlights this year, Morán says, include artist-led projects such as Andrea Zittel's High Desert Test Sites booth. It will exhibit ceramics and other objects from the Joshua Tree-based nonprofit. As well as a particularly meta showing by the New York-Based gallery A Hug From the Art World. It will display about 40 action figure figurines of famous artists by Jeffrey Dalesan. "I do — think a Jeff Koons doll with a balloon dog or a David Hockney figurine perched near the hotel's David Hockney painted pool."

"It's a poke at the art world, it's a poke at celebrity. It's really fun," Morán says.

Morán isn't worried about the five fairs cutting into one another's attendance because the fairs are all distinct. "People seek out parts of each fair that are more interesting to them," he says. "If you're more interested in photography, you're gonna go to the photography fair. If you're really zoned in on contemporary art, Frieze and Felix will have that covered. The L.A. Art Show might have more historical/modern art presentations. I think there's a little something for everybody."

## SPRING/BREAK ART SHOW LA IS TAKING PLACE IN UNIQUE LOCATIONS

At Spring/Break Art Show LA, also opening Wednesday, that distinction means showing contemporary art by emerging and midcareer artists in unique, historic or underused architectural locations. Last year it occupied a former 1940s munitions factory in Culver City, where it will again be housed this year, a venue now known as Skylight Culver City. It didn't stage a 2021 fair due to COVID, but its 2020 fair filled 70,000 square feet of the industrial-looking Row DTLA. Its inaugural 2019 fair was in a former fruit and vegetable warehouse on the edge of the downtown L.A. Arts District.

"That juxtaposition of disparate elements is the key," says fair co-founder and co-director Andrew Gori. Spring/Break Art Show LA is a curator-led fair, organized around an annual theme, at which independent curators participate free in exchange for the fair taking a cut of sales. The model is meant to eliminate overhead and encourage experimentation.

The theme creates a dialogue between works in the various booths. The fair plans to feature about 60 curated exhibitions — last year there were 50 — and it will be adding participants before it opens.

"We realized a lot of the people we would be showing wouldn't be able to afford renting real estate at a fair, especially emerging artists and curators spending their own money to get those artists out there," Gori says. "So we give independent curators free space and we run all sales through us and our online platform and we take 35%. That way we can encourage more groundbreaking, less commercial projects."

Works at Spring/Break Art Show LA span mediums, including painting, sculpture, installations, photography, performance and multimedia. Last year's theme was "Neo-medieval" — "a time of plague," Gori says. This year, in response to a feeling of hope that we're beyond COVID, or at least in a time of renewal, the theme is "Naked Lunch," nodding to "Neo-Renaissance," Gori says. The inspiration comes from the Manet painting "Le Déjeuner sur l'herbe" ("The Luncheon on the Grass") depicting young bohemians enjoying a picnic outdoors, semi-clothed, "appreciating the body, the outdoors, bohemian pleasure — a far cry from the dark ages of the Neo-medieval show," Gori says.

How does Spring/Break Art Show LA aim to compete with the bigger art fairs during such an active art moment in the city? It doesn't. Gori describes the fair as having a "symbiotic relationship."

"We don't feel in competition with the other fairs," Gori says. "We feel like the little birds that nestle between the feet of the larger hippos. We use the time that the larger fairs create — the moment — to fix a little bit of the light on emerging artists."

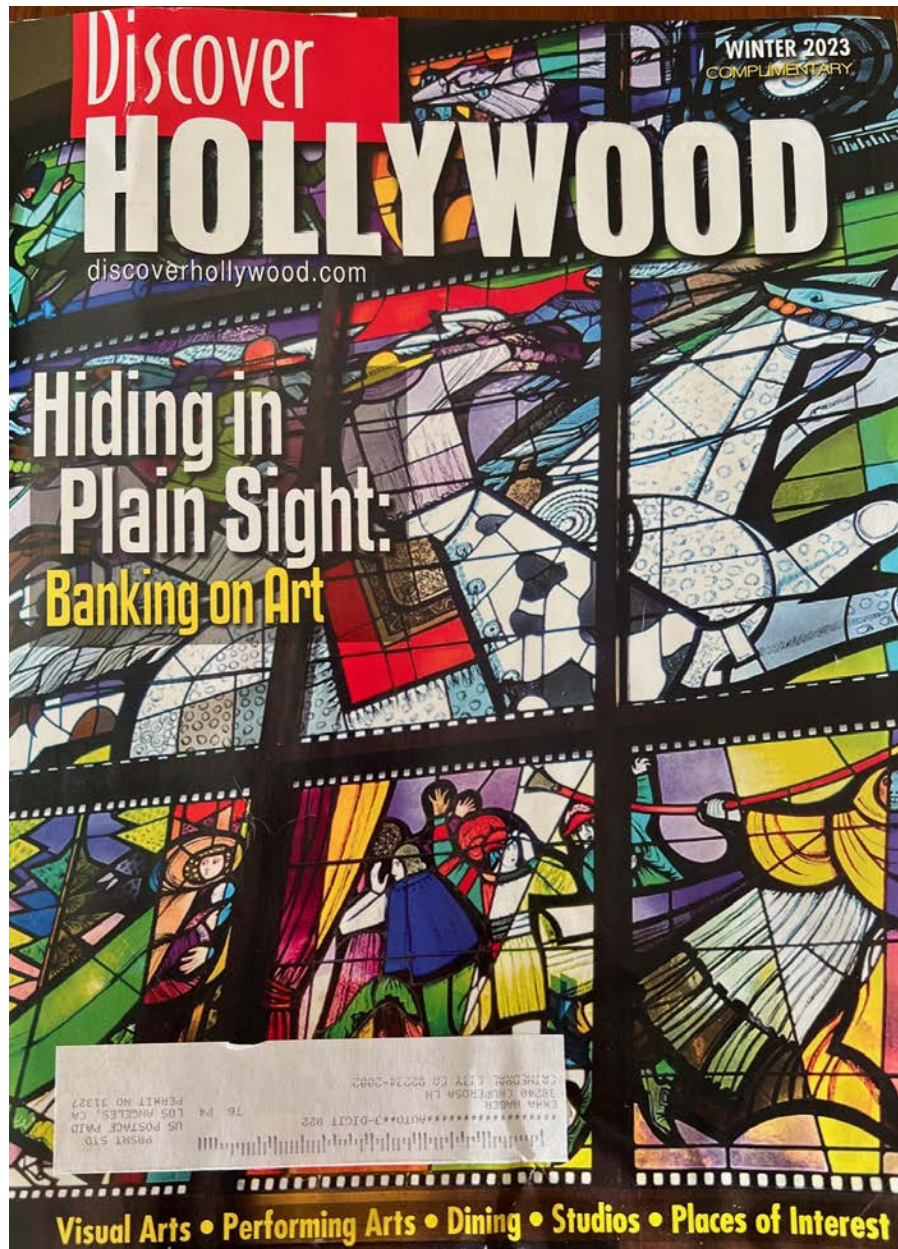
