Gallery Highlights...Contemporary Art and the LA Art Show European Pavilion

The LA Art Show continues in its commitment to present a broad and ambitious program of art from some of the most forward-thinking galleries around the world. This month, we highlight El Claustre Art Gallery from Spain, Paris based, 193 Gallery and American gallery, Markowicz Fine Art, participating exhibitors at the upcoming LA Art Show.

Gallery Highlights

Modern and Contemporary: Markowicz Fine Art

We look forward to welcoming first-time exhibitor Markowicz Fine Art to the LA Art Show in 2023. With locations in Laguna Niguel, California, Dallas and Miami, the gallery will be presenting the work of New York based sculptor Carole A. Feuerman. One of three artists credited with starting the Hyperrealism movement in the late 1970s, Feuerman is best known for her iconic figurative works of swimmers and dancers. The only woman artist to sculpt in this style, Feuerman's realistically painted outdoor sculptures are unique.

European Pavilion: 193 Gallery

Joining our European Pavilion in 2023, Paris-based 193 Gallery focuses on a diverse program of contemporary art from Southeast Asia, Africa, the Caribbean, South America, Europe, Oceania and other regions of the world. For its 2023 LA Art Show exhibition, the gallery will present two series by Caribbean artist Jean-Marc Hunt.

In his *Récits Cosmogoniques* series, Hunt refers to his childhood. Taken as a whole, these mixed media works are his means of telling a story, forming a collective memory. In his *Jardin Créole* series, the painter depicts the day from his garden and the street outside his studio. Traditions ranging from slavery to the present day combine with nature, representing the union of his worlds. Born in Strasbourg, France, Hunt lives in Guadeloupe.

European Pavilion: El Claustre Art Gallery

Also joining our European Pavilion for the first time in 2023 is El Claustre Art Gallery. With locations in Girona and Figueres, Spain, the gallery's program embraces a broad range of artistic trends from classic to contemporary. First opened in 1982, El Claustre collaborates with museums and other entities in various cultural events and projects.

For its LA Art Show debut, the gallery will showcase the work of selected artists, including contemporary figurative painters Diaz Almà and Elena Montull.

Diaz Almà

Diaz Almà is a Spanish figurative painter and director of the Barcelona Academy of Art. His Red Studio series, characterized by saturated, vivid reds, offers a peek inside the artist's studio and the collaborative dialogue between the painter and his models. In Red Studio, academicism and abstraction coexist on the canvas, a synthesis of layers of technical research the artist has acquired.





Elena Montull

Born in Fraga (Huesca) in 1976, Montull captures the fragility of the human figure through an intimate and introspective realism in which she demonstrates a mastery of line, color and light. Her work is characterized by an aura of mystery in which the figure appears in a sort of diffuse atmospheric, dreamlike environment, capturing the movement of an instant of life.






