
## **LA Art Show Gears Up for 2023 Edition**

# Gallery Highlight: William Havu Gallery

Highly anticipated at the LA Art Show 2023 edition, we look forward to welcoming first-time exhibitor William Havu Gallery. Established in 1973 in Aspen, the gallery re-located to Denver in 1998. Through its exciting exhibition program, William Havu Gallery emphasizes national and international trends in realism and abstraction with a focus on notable regional mid-career and established artists.

For its debut exhibition at the LA Art Show, the gallery will present the work of California based ceramic artist Cheryl Ann Thomas, who creates intricate sculptures using the age-old coiling technique. When fired in the kiln, her tall cylinders of thin, coiled porcelain collapse and fold in on themselves. Chance and unpredictability dictate the process. Her intuitive, organic approach imitates processes in the natural world. "The fact that it's built up coil by coil," Thomas says, "that's the way a lot of things in nature grow."

The artist says she "invites the physics of failure during the firing." Completed, the slumped over shapes suggest repositories along with a sense of abandonment.






