

We're pleased to present the multi-media "Diversity Walks and Talks," a performative recreation of a beauty pageant by celebrated Los Angeles-based performance artist, Miss Art World as one of the highlights of the DIVERSEartLA program coming to the LA Art Show in 2020.



Miss Art World's performance "Diversity Walks and Talks" is a celebration of the individuals that make up LA's diverse culture while questioning beauty norms portrayed in Hollywood and the media. The self-titled Miss Art World, once a pageant participant herself, "blends the feminine and feminist into one." Contrasting the industry's focus on standardized notions of beauty, this performance celebrates the striking diversity seen throughout the communities of Los Angeles.

For this performance, Miss Art World will pre-select and interview participants to walk the runway at the upcoming LA Art Show. Their descriptions about what diversity represents to them will play during the runway performance Spectators will also be recruited

spontaneously during the event to walk the runway. This performance invites individual proclaimers of LA's culture to strut the runway in celebration of their uniqueness.

Throwback to 2012

The 17th annual LA Art Show was held at the LA Convention Center, concurrent with The Getty's inaugural edition of its influential "Pacific Standard Time" Initiative. Tied to that citywide collaborative event, LAAS hosted an exclusive performance, "The Myths of Rape" by influential performance artists Leslie Labowitz-Starus and Suzanne Lacy.

Among the most popular installations at the 2012 edition of LAAS was Mark Mothersbaugh's "Scion Car Sculpture," which debuted at the fair before its installation at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Los Angeles. Although Mothersbaugh remains best-known as the founder of the new wave/post-punk band DEVO, his participation in the visual art world began much earlier and continues through the present day. The startling, and somewhat surreal, installation featured two Scions which had been cut in half after the driver's seats and re-fused together—creating a mirrored effect—one with two front ends forever in opposition while the other, rendered nearly useless, composed of the paired rear-halves of the two cars.

The sculptural installation complemented an ongoing series of altered photographs by Mothersbaugh, titled "Beautiful Mutants," which operate at the haunting edge of reality, known as the uncanny valley. The artist describes the unsettling works as "pulled from man's past...then 'corrected' into sickeningly beautiful beings. It is a study of humans via symmetry using photos both recent & vintage."




