
Spotlight on Timothy Yarger Los Angeles Projects

Former St. Jude Patient Draws Inspiration from Art

When Kris Keys was seven years old, she was diagnosed with a rare blood disorder and was treated at St. Jude. When the young patient had to have a blood transfusion, the nurses at St. Jude distracted her with art to take her mind off the needles. Inspired by her early encounter with art-making, Keys went on to study fashion design and now has a career in fashion illustration. When she wanted to tie her life story to fashion, her doctor at St. Jude gave her slides of her own blood cells – which led to a womenswear collection called Hematology. Key's Red Cell and Jaundice travel scarves feature her dreamy haunting prints, and preserve a lasting legacy of how her blood inspired her art.
