The LA Art Show looks forward to welcoming Angie Bonino, featured artist with the Museum of Art of Lima, Peru, as a part of DIVERSEartLA 2021. For the upcoming iteration of the fair, DIVERSEartLA curator Marisa Caichiolo will focus on the documentation of women artists in the forefront of museums and art institutions. "*The project will be a compilation of material, as well as an exhibition featuring the work of women artists who have played a central role in the development of new media practices within art institutions and through history,"* said Caichiolo.



A multi-media artist who primarily produces video and video installations, Bonino also creates animation, digital projects, graphic prints, drawings, paintings and sculpture. Underlying all her artistic pursuits, Bonino's predominant aesthetic intention is to question the image. Her goal is to reveal, through hypermedia image production and transmission, the dissemination of the invisible, occult, power spheres and systems that determine the configuration of our contemporary image-dominated world. Her work invites the viewer to look beyond the engulfing universal screen that traps and subjects our eyes, but does not let us see.



Born in Lima, Bonino has traveled widely and lived in Barcelona for several years. In 2019, her work was featured in a solo exhibition at the MEIAC Iberoamerican Museum of Contemporary Art in Badajoz, Spain as well as at ARCO Madrid.

NEW: 2021 LA Art Show European Pavilion Highlight

Pigment Gallery presents David Morago

Pigment Gallery is producing an exclusive project to be shown as part of the European Pavilion at the 2021 edition of the LA Art Show. Building on the interest generated by the work of featured gallery artist David Morago in recent years, the Barcelona-based gallery will present a limited edition of 30 monotypes produced from two special engravings by the artist. The first work is a dramatic large scale engraving of a shark. Each work in the series of 30 will be a monotype, as Morago will intervene with acrylic medium, adding elements of color to these unique individual limited edition prints.

Chaos: Doris Ernst and Sun Yao Joint Exhibition

COSPACE Gallery recently presented, *Chaos: Doris Ernst and Sun Yao Joint Exhibition* in its new Shanghai location. The exhibition (May 26 to July 5, 2020) included more than a dozen paintings and documents, including many small manuscripts and photos, which were shown for the first time. The exhibition thematically explored the topic of chaos from the point of the two artists, one German, the other Chinese.

With the disaster sweeping the world in 2020, the prevailing order and rhythm of life have been broken, forcing people to re-examine their own vulnerability and face both social and personal chaos. In their two-person show, Doris Ernst and Sun Yao discussed the topic of chaos through their individual practices. Some of the works presented were newly created during the pandemic. For Ernst, rebellion against order and rationality is a motive for creation. Using a scraper and found objects, she stacks, wipes and covers pigments layer by layer, allowing her compositions to resolve on the canvas through a process of repetition and randomness. The work of Sun Yao reflects chaotic situations of conflict through imagery permeated with violence. Building on a series of strokes and textures, his work is intended to transcend the internal, physical and natural, entering a world of transformation and inseparability, returning to karma and harmony from chaos.
