

Los Angeles, CA. (July 12, 2021) Nikolas Soren Goodich will debut his Plexiglass Portraits installation at the LA Art Show from July 29 to August 1, 2021 in Booth 1220, located in the South Hall of the Los Angeles Convention Center (1201 South Figueroa Street, Los Angeles, CA 90015).

Well-known in Los Angeles for his signature images of duality rendered as painted facial profiles seen together or apart, Nikolas Soren Goodich was trained at the Rhode Island School of Design, Boston School of the Museum of Fine Arts, and the Art Institute of Chicago, and completed his undergraduate degree in Painting and Printmaking at Virginia Commonwealth University. Goodich's work, anchored in his African American and European bi-racial heritage, investigates non-gendered portraiture in numerous formal modes. In his unique process, Goodich paints upon clear plexiglass, hand-prints from one panel to another, layers the panels together, and then assembles them onto canvas as diptychs.



The New Normal

We thought the world would end in fire, or possibly in ice. And now we know it can end with a virus. As a child growing up in Taiwan and then later in the US during the Cold War, I often imagined—and literally dreamed—how the world would end. Earthquakes and nuclear holocaust were my usual Apocalyptic scenarios. I did occasionally imagine a strange, contagious disease, but not one quite like COVID-19 where the entire world would be held hostage, so widespread and for so long.

Now as we slip back into public life, we realize that we have changed, and so has the world we return to. Many people will continue to work from home, in full or in part. Students have gotten trained in online classrooms. As someone who's been teaching on Zoom, it's clear that online education can't match the real-life one, though it can certainly supplement it. Museums and galleries have run virtual exhibitions and presentations, and are now reopening at limited capacity. By the time this is published, they could be at increased or full capacity. However, in the past year programming has undergone a radical shift—with more, deserved attention paid to POC and women artists. The world we return to is not the world we left last March. How could it be? Which changes are to be enduring and systemic remains to be seen.






Rita Ora was impossible to miss as she stepped out for the Los Angeles Art Show's opening night held at the **LA** Convention Center Downtown.

L.A. Art Show kicked off at the Convention Center Thursday night, and there's something different on display this year. Alongside the many traditional galleries showing everything from photography to sculpture is Vellum L.A., which will be the city's first brick-and-mortar gallery dealing in NFT (non-fungible token) art when it opens on Melrose Avenue this fall.

It's the first NFT art display in the fair's history; in fact, it's the first live NFT showcase at any fair. In partnership with with the NFT marketplace SuperRare and L.A.-based media and design firm StandardVision, Vellum is showing a series of digital works by woman and non-binary artists on digital "canvases" developed specifically to display NFT art. Want to pick up a piece you see at the show? You better be packing ETH cryptocurrency.

In case it's all still a little confusing and you don't yet know your Bitcoin from your blockchain, Vellum L.A. curator Sinziana Velicescu walked us through the next big thing in the art world.

For years I've been attending the LA Art Show. This year, I'm making my claim in (digital) print: the art fair model needs to be reimagined.

Billed as "the most comprehensive international contemporary art show in America," the LA Art Show is an organized maze of booths offering a spectrum of art: at one end is fine art by modern artists such as Egon Schiele; at the other is a contemporary, bloated mashup of post-Banksy, urban pop art, infused with references to Jean-Michel Basquiat, Andy Warhol, Blek le Rat, and Robbie Conal. The 2021 show felt stagnant and many of the works derivative; the fair's design only amplified this sensation.

A few experiential elements were incorporated, including an NFT selection, and those were the most compelling aspects of the entire event. Curated by Marisa Caichiolo, the DIVERSEartLA section focused on "women and non-binary artists at the forefront of work at the intersection of art, science and technology represented." Standout installations included Carmen Argote's "Last Light," Zeynep Abes "Memory Place," and Ana Marcos' "DATA | ergo sum | RELOADED." All of these works probed identity via evocative methods; this was the poetic, emotional root of the fair, but the canopy above was sparse and malnourished.
